**Delta doubles flights from Paris to Boston**  
*U.S. airline will launch a second daily flight in Summer 2020*

**PARIS, 24 September 2019** – Delta Air Lines is growing its network in France in 2020 with the launch of a new seasonal service between Paris and Boston. The new service doubles Delta’s frequency on the route. When combined with partner Air France and KLM, customers will have a choice of five daily services between the two cities next summer.

Starting on May 22, 2020, the flight will bring the total number of Delta’s services from Paris to the United States to 15 a day to 11 destinations. The airline also serves New York-JFK from Nice between April and October. When combined with Air France and KLM, the two airlines offer 39 daily flights from France to the United States. Delta will operate its Boeing 767-300 aircraft on the Paris-Boston route, which is equipped with 25 lie-flat seats in Delta One, 29 seats in Delta Comfort+ and 171 seats in Main Cabin.

“As one of our biggest European markets, we continue to focus on France and providing more travel options to the United States,” said Roberto Ioriatti, Delta’s vice president Transatlantic. “We’re proud to be the biggest carrier across the Atlantic, and always have our sights set on offering our customers the best experience we can alongside our local partners.”

Delta has nearly doubled its daily departures out of Boston, the carrier’s newest hub, since 2015. The carrier serves more than 50 destinations from Logan International, offering customers flights to up to 18 international destinations, together with its partners.

All of Delta’s trans-Atlantic flights feature the carrier’s premium Delta One experience, which includes a dedicated in-cabin flight attendant; a 180-degree flat-bed seat; extra-wide inflight entertainment screens; and seasonally rotating, chef-designed Delta One menus with the option to pre-select first choice of entrée, paired with wines hand-selected by Master Sommelier Andrea Robinson.

In addition to Delta’s award-winning operational reliability and service, all cabins of service on flights between Europe and the U.S. include complimentary meals, snacks and beverages. This November, Delta is launching a first-of-its-kind bistro-style international Main Cabin experience featuring welcome cocktails, hot-towel service and mix-and-match options for premium appetizers and larger entrees.

All seats on all Transatlantic flights also offer personal entertainment systems with free entertainment, on-demand Wi-Fi for purchase, free mobile messaging, high-capacity overhead bins, upgraded amenity kits and more. More international onboard enhancements are coming soon, like refreshed ear buds and headsets, to further demonstrate the airline’s commitment to creating a best-in-class experience all customers can look forward to.
